	The selection of candidates for various PG courses is based on marks scored by the candidates in the entrance test and marks secured by them upto 5 th semester / II year of the UG Degree. A merit list is prepared following the reservation norms of the Tamil Nadu Government. Programmes specific cut-off marks are generated based on the number of applicants and waiting list is also prepared. The students are duly intimated and called for admission. For some courses direct admission is also done.		
	The admission for professional courses such as MBA and MCA is done based on marks scored by the candidates in Tamil Nadu Common Entrance Test (TANCET) and marks secured by them upto 5 th semester / II year of the UG Degree.
